THIS MATTER was heard on September 17, 2013, by the North Carolina Board of Pharmacy (“Board”) located at 6015 Farrington Road, Suite 201, Chapel Hill, North Carolina, upon the request of Carolyn Sue Calverly (“Petitioner”) for the Board to modify an Order Reinstating License. Board members Minton, Marks, McLaughlin, Chesson, Day, and Mixon conducted the hearing. After hearing the testimony of witnesses, adjudging the credibility of the witnesses, and receiving evidence, the Board makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On October 19, 2010, the Board issued an Order Reinstating License to Petitioner (the “2010 Order”), who holds North Carolina pharmacist license number 08068.
2. The 2010 Order reinstated Petitioner’s license to practice pharmacy with conditions.
3. Petitioner asks the Board to modify the 2010 Order by lifting the following conditions:
 6. Petitioner shall not serve as a pharmacist manager of any pharmacy.
4. Petitioner asks the Board to modify the 2010 Order by amending the following condition:
 8. Petitioner may not be employed as a pharmacist more than 30 hours per week, on the average. This limitation may be extended at the discretion of

NCPRN, and Petitioner shall notify the Board's Executive Director if NCPRN extends this limitation.

5. NCPRN supports the requested modifications of the 2010 Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Petitioner has demonstrated that, with modifications to the 2010 Order, she will continue to practice pharmacy with reasonable care, safety and competence

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Petitioner's 2010 Order is modified as follows:

1. Condition 6 of the 2010 Order is lifted.
2. Condition 8 is amended to state:

For the duration of her NCPRN contract, Petitioner may not be employed as a pharmacist more than 30 hours per week, on the average. This limitation may be extended at the discretion of NCPRN, and Petitioner shall notify the Board's Executive Director if NCPRN extends this limitation.

Other conditions of the 2009 Order remain in effect.
