THIS MATTER came to be considered the North Carolina Board of Pharmacy (“Board”) on April 15, 2014 upon the request of Celeste Snidow (“Petitioner”) to modify the terms of a February 16, 2010 Board order reinstating her North Carolina license to practice pharmacy number 09506. Board members Minton, McLaughlin, Chesson, Day, and Mixon heard this matter. After hearing the testimony of witnesses, adjudging the credibility of the witnesses, and receiving evidence, the Board makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On January 16, 2010, the Board issued an Order Reinstating License to Petitioner (the “2010 Order”), who holds North Carolina pharmacist license number 09506.
2. The 2010 Order reinstated Petitioner’s license to practice pharmacy with conditions.
3. Petitioner asks the Board to lift Condition 3 of the 2010 Order: “Petitioner shall obtain prior approval of all employment as a pharmacist from the Board’s Executive Director.”
4. Petitioner asks the Board to lift Condition 8 of the 2010 Order: “Petitioner shall not serve as a preceptor of pharmacy students.”

5. Petitioner asks the Board to modify Condition 7 of the 2010 Order: "Petitioner shall not serve as a pharmacist manager of any pharmacy."
6. Since the Board reinstated Petitioner's license, Petitioner has been employed as a clinical pharmacist in a hospital practice for approximately four years. The Board has received no complaint concerning Petitioner's practice during that time.
7. North Carolina Pharmacist Recovery Network ("NCPRN") supports these modifications of Petitioner's 2010 Order.
8. Petitioner remains under a treatment and monitoring agreement with NCPRN through February 16, 2015.
9. NCPRN reports that Petitioner has been in full compliance with her NCPRN treatment and monitoring obligations since the 2010.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Petitioner has demonstrated that, with modifications to the 2010 Order, she will continue to practice pharmacy with appropriate care, safety and competence

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Petitioner's 2010 Order is amended as follows:
Conditions 3 and 8 are lifted.

Condition 7 is modified as follows: During the term of her NCPRN treatment and monitoring agreement, Petitioner shall not serve as a pharmacist manager of any pharmacy unless approved to do so by NCPRN and the Board's Executive Director. Upon completion of her NCPRN treatment and monitoring agreement, Petitioner shall not serve as a pharmacist manager of any pharmacy unless approved to do so in advance by the Board's Executive Director.

Other conditions of the 2010 Order remain in effect.


