THIS MATTER was heard on July 17, 2012, by the North Carolina Board of Pharmacy (“Board”) located at 6015 Farrington Road, Suite 201, Chapel Hill, North Carolina, pursuant to a Notice of Hearing, dated June 19, 2012, issued to Reginald Jamel Health (“Respondent”). Board members Minton, Marks, McLaughlin, Chesson, Day, and Mixon conducted this hearing. After hearing the testimony of witnesses, adjudging the credibility of the witnesses, and receiving evidence, the Board makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent holds pharmacy technician registration number 27586 from the North Carolina Board of Pharmacy.
2. On June 19, 2012 Board of Pharmacy staff received a letter from Lorraine Aubin, Lead Agent, North Carolina Child Support Enforcement, Division of Social Services, Department of Health and Human Services. Ms. Aubin’s letter informed Board staff that Respondent was “delinquent in court-ordered child support or [was] subject to outstanding warrants for failure to comply with the terms of a court order for child support.”
3. Ms. Aubin’s letter further stated that, in accordance with G.S. § 110-142.1, the Board must notify Respondent of its “intent to suspend or revoke occupational, professional, or business licenses immediately.”
4. On June 19, 2012, Board staff sent notice of intent, as required by G.S. § 110-142.1., to revoke Respondent’s pharmacy technician registration via certified mail, return receipt

requested. The letter returned unclaimed. Board staff sent the required notice of intent to Respondent's electronic mail address on July 9, 2012. The electronic mail message went unanswered. The Board's Executive Director attempted to contact Respondent at the telephone number listed on his Board of Pharmacy registration. The phone call was not returned. The Board's Executive Director then obtained a different phone number from one of Respondent's employers. The Board's Executive Director successfully contacted Respondent at that number of July 9, 2012, and explained the DHHS notice. Respondent instructed the Board's Executive Director to electronically transmit the notice to a second email address. The Board's Executive Director did so.

5. The notice stated that the Board would revoke Respondent's pharmacy technician registration at its July 17, 2012 meeting unless he wished to challenge the DHHS determination that he was non-compliant with a child support order within the statutorily prescribed time.

6. Respondent did not respond to the Board's notice.

7. Respondent did not appear for the Board's hearing.

8. The Board received no communication from Respondent or DHHS indicating that Respondent had challenged his alleged non-compliance with a child support order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Under the undisputed facts as found, G.S. § 110-142.1(e) requires that the Board revoke Respondent's pharmacy technician registration.

WHEREFORE, it is hereby **ORDERED** that the pharmacy technician registration of Respondent Reginald Jamel Heath, Number 27586, is hereby **REVOKED**.
