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VOLUNTARY SURRENDER

REGISTRATION FOR CAUSE

Brad Marshall was issued registration number 17720 by the North Carolina Board of Pharmacy on December 7, 2006, such registration being active until December 31, 2007.

Brad Marshall admits that while being registered as a technician at Eckerd Drugs, located at 4502 Shipyard Blvd., Wilmington, North Carolina, he committed acts that give the North Carolina Board of Pharmacy ("Board") sufficient cause to revoke his registration. Considering that, Mr. Marshall voluntarily surrenders his registration as a Pharmacy Technician in North Carolina. The surrender of the registration is made voluntarily and without pressure, coercion, or the threat of force being made against him. As a result of the voluntary surrender, Mr. Marshall shall not be present in any pharmacy except as a customer with a valid prescription from a treating physician.


Mr. Marshall understands and accepts that, at any point in the future, he may petition for reinstatement by submitting a request to the Board of Pharmacy, in writing. Upon a request for reinstatement, the Board will schedule a hearing at its convenience, which may or may not occur at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting following the request. There is no presumption, guarantee or other implication intended within this document that the Board will reinstate the registration. The decision will be made by the Board based on consideration of all available evidence presented at a formal hearing before the Board. The registration will not be returned until and unless the Board issues a reinstatement order after any formal hearing.
