Ethics Statement & Welcome

President Minton read the Ethics Statement regarding conflicts of interest and/or appearances of conflicts of interest of any Board member. No conflicts were noted by Board members.

Consideration of Minutes of the October 2017 Meeting

The members received the November 21, 2017 meeting minutes prior to this meeting for review. It was moved by Mr. Graves, seconded by Mr. Mixon, to approve the minutes as submitted. The motion passed with no dissenting votes.

Presentation of FY 2016-17 Financial Audit

Sandy Newell, Bernard Robinson & Co. LLP, presented the financial audit report for fiscal year 2016-2017.

On a motion from Mr. Haywood, seconded by Dr. Bowman with no dissenting votes, the Board approved the audit as presented. Ms. Newell noted that her staff would submit the audit report as required by Chapter 93B of the North Carolina General Statutes.

Proposed Consent Orders Regarding Letko Entities

Board Counsel Clint Pinyan presented proposed consent orders that would vacate the summary suspensions of Yanceyville Drug d/b/a The Drug Store, Permit #13215; US Healthcare Supply, LLC, DME Permit #01757; Optimum Health Pharmacy, LLC, Permit #13122; Keystone Choice Pharmacy, LLC, Permit #13073; Heritage Diabetic Supply, Inc, DME Permit #02131; Dependable Diabetic Supply, LLC, DME Permit #02247; and Woods Pharmacy, LLC, Permit #12870. Mr. Pinyan stated that all of the permits have agreed to take inactive status and would no longer conduct business in North Carolina.

After discussion, on a motion from Mr. Mixon, seconded by Dr. Bowman with no dissenting votes, the Board accepted all of the proposed consent orders.

A copy of the consent orders can be found elsewhere in the minutes and are incorporated herein.

Technician Erica Smith, Registration #51269, Disciplinary Hearing

Technician Erica Smith, registration #51269, was the subject of a disciplinary hearing regarding non-disclosure of criminal charges on her initial technician registration application. Ms. Smith was noticed for the hearing; the notice was accepted by certified mail, return receipt requested but she was not present for the hearing. Board Counsel Clint Pinyan stated that Ms. Smith submitted an initial technician registration application on March 7, 2017. On her application, she answered "no" to the question that asked whether she had ever been charged or convicted of a felony or misdemeanor when in fact she had been charged twice with felony receipt of stolen property and misdemeanor charge of possession of marijuana.

After presentation of evidence and testimony, on a motion from Dr. Bowman, seconded by Dr. Vance with no dissenting votes, the Board revoked Erica Smith's technician registration #51269.

A copy of the final order can be found elsewhere in the minutes and is incorporated herein.

The Board adjourned for a break at 9:50am and returned to open session at 10:10am.

Recommendation to Fund a Grant Program Through North Carolina Physicians Health Program

At the September 2017 Board Member Retreat, Joe Jordan, CEO, North Carolina Physicians Health Program and North Carolina Veterinary Health Program (PHP), and Cindy Clark, Assistant Director PHP, presented a proposal for a Board-sponsored program to subsidize substance use disorder evaluation and treatment costs for licensees and/or registrants. At the conclusion of that presentation, the Board designated Dr. Bowman, Dr. Vance, and Joey McLaughlin as a committee to review the proposal further and make a specific recommendation to the full Board at the January meeting.

Mr. Campbell state that the committee has finished its work and recommends that that the Board enter into a Grant Agreement with NCPHP. Under the Agreement, the Board would transfer \$1,100,000 to NCPHP, which NCPHP would treat as a restricted asset, in a managed fund, to be used solely for the grant program; \$100,000 of the funds would be available to use immediately for qualifying pharmacists, technicians, or pharmacy students; \$1,000,000 would serve as a principal contribution and earnings from the principal contribution would be used for the grant program.

After discussion and clarification on program funding from Mr. Jordan, on a motion from Dr. Bowman, seconded by Mr. Graves with no dissenting votes, the Board approved the recommendation in principal. Mr. Campbell was directed to proceed with negotiating a final agreement with PHP and to present a proposed final agreement to the full Board at the appropriate time.

APhA Institute on Alcoholism and Drug Dependencies Grant Program

The APhA Institute on Alcoholism and Drug Dependencies program will be held May 30, 2018 – June 3, 2018. NABP will provide grants for state Board members to attend the meeting again this year. The deadline for applying for the grant is February 15, 2018.

After discussion, it was the consensus of the Board to have any member who wishes to attend the meeting to contact Mr. Minton or Mr. Campbell.

NABP Annual Meeting Voting Delegate Travel Grant

The 2018 NABP Annual Meeting will be held May 5-8, 2018 in Denver, CO. After discussion it was the consensus of the Board that Mr. Minton would serve as voting delegate for the Board with Mr. Campbell serving as the alternate delegate. Mr. Campbell stated he would submit the NABP Travel Grant application on behalf of Mr. Minton as delegate.

Proposed Change in the Date of the April 2018 Meeting

Mr. Minton stated that he has a conflict with the April 17, 2018 Board meeting date and requested that the meeting be held the week prior or the week after the scheduled date.

After discussion, on a motion from Dr. Bowman, seconded by Mr. Minton with no dissenting votes, the Board approved moving the April 2018 Board meeting to April 24, 2018 with prehearing conference to be held on Monday, April 23, 2018.

Inquiry from James Herring Concerning CE on Stress Management

Pharmacist James Herring sent a letter to Board staff noting his concerns about stress levels among practicing pharmacists. He has inquired about the Board's interest in mandating an annual requirement for a stress management Continuing Education (CE).

After discussion it was the consensus of the Board to direct Mr. Campbell to contact Mr. Herring to advise him that the Board took the matter under advisement but because there are available CEs regarding stress management and the Board has recently updated the rules pertaining to continuing education, the Board would take no action at this time.

Financial Report

Krystal Smith, Account Manager, presented the December 2017 financial report to the Board.

Ms. Smith also requested that the Board approve an adjustment to the FY 2017-18 budget for funding of the NCAP Opioid Educational Program approved by the Board at the November 2017 meeting; payment to Third Wheel Media for the Opioid Crisis Response public service campaign approved at the September 29, 2017 Board retreat; and software escrow services for the Thoughtspan database. On a motion from Dr. Bowman, seconded by Mr. Mixon with no dissenting votes, the Board approved the proposed budget adjustment.

Investigations and Inspections Report

Joshua Kohler, Director of Investigations, presented the 2017 investigative report.

Mr. Campbell received an inquiry from John Vitiello at NC Medicaid for clarification on rules regarding "virtual" counseling for respiratory care devices. After discussion, it was the consensus of the Board to forward the inquiry to the DME Subcommittee for guidance.

Mr. Campbell presented a statement from the Telepharmacy Committee regarding their work regarding telepharmacy in North Carolina. After research, site visits, and presentations regarding telepharmacy in other states; the committee recommends that the Board take no unilateral action at this point.

Mr. Mixon questioned whether there has been any update has with the Memorandum of Understanding with the FDA concerning regarding DQSA. Mr. Campbell stated that there has been no change to date.

Mr. Minton requested an update of the CPP Advisory Committee. Staff will update the Board members on the CPP application and approval process at the February 2018 meeting, as well as present statistics on currently-credentialed CPPs.
