

President William (Bill) Mixon called the meeting to order at 10 am. Due to the COVID-19 state of emergency, the meeting was convened by teleconference. Board Members Ashley Duggins, Keith Vance, Andy Bowman, Wallace Nelson, Mischelle Corbin and Bill Mixon were in attendance. Members of the public also attended the meeting via teleconference.

Ethics Statement & Welcome

President Mixon read the Ethics Statement regarding conflicts of interest. No conflicts were noted by Board members.

Consideration of November 2021 Meeting Minutes

Consideration of December 7, 2021 Minutes

It was moved by Mr. Nelson, seconded by Dr. Bowman, to approve the minutes. The motion passed with no dissenting votes.

License Reinstatement Application – Lorne Elliot Basskin

Dr. Basskin has asked the Board to waive the requirement that he obtain 500 hours of internship under the supervision of a North Carolina-licensed pharmacist. He has not requested waiver of the CE requirement or the requirement to take and pass the MPJE. Dr. Basskin has submitted a letter detailing his work history and the reasons for his requested waiver.

Mr. Campbell reviewed with the Board Rule .1602's requirements for licensure without examination after extended absence from the practice of pharmacy, as well as the Board's policy guidance on that rule.

After discussion, Mr. Nelson moved to approve Dr. Basskin's request and grant him permission to complete the licensure process based on work performed under supervision of a licensed pharmacist at UNC Healthcare since last November. Mr. Basskin still must take and pass the North Carolina MPJE and fulfill CE requirements. Mr. Basskin agreed to notify the Board if his practice role at UNC Healthcare changes before April 30th, 2022, to determine whether any additional experiential hours are necessary. Dr. Duggins seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Scheduling of March 2022 Board of Pharmacy Meeting

By the consensus of the Board, the March meeting was moved to Tuesday, March 8, 2022.

Financial Report

Monthly Financial Report (*Brown*)

The members received the monthly financial report prior to this meeting. The members reviewed and had no questions.

Budget and Finance Committee Recommendations Concerning Board Investment Policy

The Board's Budget and Finance Committee met on Tuesday, December 7, 2021 to receive market condition updates from RBC and FCB, the two firms that hold the Board's capital reserve accounts. The Committee also reviewed the Board's existing investment policy and does not recommend any changes to that policy.

Licensing Update

2022 Renewal Season (*Betz*)

Ms. Betz provided a briefing on the 2022 license/permit/registration renewal season and included a comparison with 2021 renewal season. Renewal trends are consistent with previous years. Ms. Betz noted there were noticeable decrease in calls/emails concerning forgotten log-in information, demonstrating that changes to the recovery process put in place this year are working.

Pharmacists Licensed by Examination - January 1, 2021 - December 31, 2021

Board staff provided a list of all pharmacists licensed by exam in 2021 to be included in the January 2022 Board minutes.

Board Member Elections for Northern and Western District Seats (*Moore*)

Kristin Moore presented an update on the Board member elections for Northern and Western District seats. The members agreed to meet on March 2, 2022 at 2 pm to review and certify the election results.

Investigative Report (*Stefanyk*)

Krystal Stefanyk, Director of Inspections, introduced the Board's newest inspector/investigator Ruben Junez, a former DEA contractor, who will be working in District 3. Sacejewia White, who had been in District 3, has moved to District 4. Ms. Stefanyk then presented the 2021 investigations report.

The Board took a short break and reconvened at 11:10 am.

Rulemaking (*Pinyan, Campbell*)

Additional Discussion of Proposed Repeal of 21 NCAC 46.1417, Remote Medication Order Processing Services, and Amendments to 21 NCAC 46.1816, Procedures for Centralized Processing of Prescription Orders

At the Board's November retreat, it voted to adopt a proposed repeal of 21 NCAC 46.1417 and amendments to 21 NCAC 46.1816. This repeal and these amendments conferred a new authority for pharmacies to engage in inter-pharmacy remote medication order services. The Board's Telepharmacy Committee met several times between July 2021 and the November meeting to review each of the comments received in detail and to discuss whether and to what extent changes to the proposed repeal and amendments should be made in light of those comments.

The Committee produced a detailed memorandum discussing each of the comments and recommended responses. All Board members received and reviewed this memo well in advance of the November meeting and discussed these recommendations in detail. Board staff obtained an opinion from Staff Counsel at the North Carolina Rules Review Commission that none of the comment-responsive changes to the rule were substantial, and thus that republication of the proposal was not required. Each of the proposed changes eliminated requirements that commenters found problematic or replaced requirements with simpler, easier-to-administer options. In particular, and in response to comments, the revised rule eliminates the requirement that out-of-state pharmacy technicians providing inter-pharmacy remote medication order entry services be individually registered in North Carolina. The revised rule also provides an alternative to individual licensure in North Carolina for out-of-state pharmacists performing inter-pharmacy remote medication order entry services through a continuous monitoring service administered by the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy.

The rule was scheduled for discussion by the Rules Review Commission in December. Two days prior to the RRC meeting, CVS filed a request to address the RRC to argue, among other things, that the rule as approved by the Board should have been subject to a second round of notice and comment. In light of that late-breaking objection, Board staff pulled the rule from the RRC docket. 0

Mr. Pinyan advised that the Board could continue forward with RRC review or publish the rule for a second round of comment.

After much discussion, Dr. Vance moved to republish the rule and was seconded by Dr. Duggins. The motion failed on a 3-3 tie vote.

Mr. Pinyan will report to the RRC that the Board will not republish and will proceed with RRC review.

Proposed Publication of Permanent Rule 21 NCAC 46.2514, Long-Acting Injectable Administration

The Board enacted temporary rule .2514 to operationalize the new authority granted by S.L. 2021-3 for pharmacist administration of long-acting injectables. The temporary rule went into effect on October 1, 2021. To ensure that the rule remains in effect, the Board needs to initiate permanent rulemaking. At a December 8, 2021 meeting of the Joint Medical/Pharmacy Board Committee for Implementation of S.L. 2021- 110, all members of the Committee agreed to move forward with the permanent rulemaking process with the existing temporary rule language. Mr. Nelson moved to publish rule for notice and comment as a permanent rule. Dr. Duggins seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Proposed Publication of New Rule 21 NCAC 46.1820, Code of Ethics

S.L. 2021-110, Section 4(a) requires the Pharmacy and Medical Boards to “develop a statement of ethics for immunizing pharmacists.” Proposed new Rule .1820 would incorporate the American Pharmacist Association Code of Ethics into Board rule and provide that conduct contrary to that Code of Ethics constitutes unprofessional conduct under the Board’s G.S. 90-85.38(a) disciplinary authority. At the December 9, 2021 meeting of the Joint Medical/Pharmacy Board Committee for Implementation of S.L. 2021-110, all members of the Committee endorsed the attached rule language. Dr. Duggins moved to publish the proposed rule for notice and comment. Ms. Corbin seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Proposed Publication of Amendments to 21 NCAC 46.2507, Implement Pharmacy Technician Vaccination Authority

S.L. 2021-110, Section 4(b) requires, among other things, the Pharmacy and Medical Boards to “adopt rules to govern the administration of vaccines by pharmacy technicians as authorized in this act.” At the December 9, 2021 meeting of the Joint Medical/Pharmacy Board Committee for Implementation of S.L. 2021-110, all members of the Committee endorsed the attached rule language, which amends the existing pharmacist immunization rule

to include pharmacist technician authority. Dr. Duggins moved to publish the proposed rule for notice and comment. Mr. Wallace seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Update: Proposed Amendments to 21 NCAC 46.1606 and .1607, North Carolina Specific Education for Permit Applicants and Out-Of-State Pharmacies

Update: Proposed Amendments to 21 NCAC 46.1503, Experience in Pharmacy and Pharmacy Internship

These amendments have been published for notice and comment, and a public hearing will occur February 8, 2022, 10 a.m. No written comments received thus far.

Update: Proposed Adoption of 21 NCAC 46.2515, Remote Work By Pharmacy Personnel

This proposed new rule has been published for notice and comment, and a public hearing will occur on February 8, 2022, 10 a.m. Staff have received one comment to date – a clarifying question that will be presented to the Board at the March meeting.

Legislative Update

The General Assembly remains in session, but no updates concerning Board-affecting bills

Committee Progress Reports

Telepharmacy Committee – *Vance, Bowman, Nelson* (members); *Campbell, Pinyan* (staff)

As noted, . Committee members visited Parata Systems in Durham on December 7, 2021 to learn about direct-to-patient dispensing technologies.

Permit Meeting/Pharmacist Manager Education Committee – *Duggins, Vance* (members); *Betz, Watson, Kohler, Stefanyk* (staff).

Notice and comment rulemaking to implement committee recommendations underway. Committee staff continue to revise pharmacist manager education on-line resources.

Intern Registration System Committee – *Vance, Bowman, Corbin* (members); *Betz, Campbell, Pinyan* (staff)

Notice and comment rulemaking underway to implement committee recommendations. Committee staff working on a registration application and discussing programming needs to implement.

Working Conditions Committee – *Duggins, Vance, Bowman* (members); *Campbell, Pinyan* (staff)

Dr. Duggins spoke as chairman of the committee. She reported that the committee is listening to pharmacists and evaluating potential actions. Penny Shelton from NCAP had been working on a survey to distribute at their Leadership Forum that was later cancelled due to COVID. The Board and NCAP will team up to send out the survey in the next 4 to 6 weeks. The committee is also working on a specific form that would be submitted by pharmacists to the Board to report unsafe working conditions. This idea stemmed from the NABP Task Force on Pharmacists Working Conditions meeting last November.

NABP Annual Meeting, May 19-21, 2022, Phoenix AZ

Designate Voting Delegate and Alternate

NABP's Annual Meeting is scheduled for May 19-21, 2022 in Phoenix, Arizona. Each year, the Board must designate a voting delegate and an alternate for the meeting's business sessions. As well, NABP provides a travel grant for one Board member from each state – typically the voting delegate. Dr. Duggins volunteered to be the NCBOP delegate and Mr. Campbell will assume the role of alternate.

NABP Soliciting Candidates for Three-Year Terms on the Advisory Committee on Examinations

NABP is soliciting candidates to serve three-year terms on NABP's Advisory Committee on Examinations ("ACE"). ACE is a central, indispensable body for the development, maintenance, and administration of pharmacist licensing examinations. Mr. Campbell asked that any interested Board members to submit to Mr. Campbell a statement of interested and updated resume by close of day Friday, January 21st.
