Ethics Statement & Welcome

President Minton read the Ethics Statement regarding conflicts of interest and/or appearances of conflicts of interest of any Board member. No conflicts were noted by Board members.

Consideration of Minutes of the January 2018 Meeting

The members received the January 16, 2018 meeting minutes prior to this meeting for review. It was moved by Mr. Graves, seconded by Mr. Mixon, to approve the minutes as submitted. The motion passed with no dissenting votes.

Proposed Consent Orders Regarding Letko Entities

Board Counsel Clint Pinyan presented proposed consent orders that would vacate the summary suspensions of All American Medical Pharmacy, permit #11666; All American Medical Supplies, DME permit #02057; and All American Medical, DME permit #02247, approved by the Board at the September 19, 2017 Board meeting. Mr. Pinyan stated that the request is to lift the summary suspensions pending a pending disciplinary hearing based on changed circumstances since the Board took summary action.

After discussion, on a motion from Dr. Bowman, seconded by Mr. Minton with no dissenting votes, the Board accepted the proposed consent orders.

Clinical Pharmacist Practitioner - Overview of Regulations and Demographics

At the January 16, 2018, the Board requested an overview of CPP law, application review process, and demographics of the CPP Advisory Committee. Mr. Campbell presented that overview. Board members discussed the topics in depth.

After discussion, the Board members agreed to take under advisement the possible appointment of a liaison from the Board to the CPP Advisory Committee.

The Board adjourned for a break at 10:09am and returned to open session at 10:25am.

Report on Executive Director's Meeting with the Legislative Research Commission's Committee to Access to Healthcare in Rural North Carolina

Mr. Campbell was invited to speak to the Legislative Research Commission's Committee on Access to Healthcare in Rural North Carolina on February 15, 2018. Mr. Campbell spoke to the committee on ways in which pharmacists might be better utilized to increase healthcare access in underserved areas, which focused chiefly on collaborative practice. Mr. Campbell presented his PowerPoint presentation for the committee to the Board members and gave an overview of the other topics discussed at the meeting.

USP <800> and Non-Compounding Activities

USP chapter <800> standards governing the handling of hazardous drugs becomes effective on December 1, 2019. The Board has previously issued a statement explaining that when USP <800> is expressly incorporated into either USP chapter <795> or <797>, it will apply to compounding activities by direct operation of federal and state law.

As was discussed at the Board's retreat in September 2017, USP chapter <800> also includes standards for the handling of hazardous drugs in non-compounding activities. The Board discussed various options for Board action concerning the application of USP chapter <800> to non-compounding activities.

By consensus, the Board directed the USP <800> working group to reconvene and discuss these options, and to return with specific recommendations to the full Board at the Board's April 2018 meeting.

Update on Staff Guidance to Practicing Pharmacists

The Board has updated its guidance document for safe drug disposal. Special thanks to Vera Reinstein of Allied Behavioral Healthcare and Nidhi Gandhi of the Wingate School of Pharmacy for their effort. The document was published on the Board website on February 12th, 2018.

Several pharmacists have contacted Board staff inquiring about potential shortages of Tamiflu (oseltamivir). The Food and Drug Administration maintains a list of shortage drugs. As of the February Board meeting, Tamiflu is not on that list.

Board staff has prepared and published new guidance to pharmacists on how to monitor for drug shortages and on compounding oseltamivir oral suspension in times of FDA-listed shortage.

Summary of Permit, License, Registration Renewal for 2018

Mr. Campbell presented data on renewals of permits, registrants, and licensees. The deadline for renewal is March 1, 2018.

Mr. Campbell also provided a list of pharmacists licensed by exam in 2017, which is incorporated in the minutes.

Public Service Announcement Campaign Update (Opioid Crisis Response Committee)

The Board's first public service announcement to address the opioid crisis was broadcast in the Wilmington/Greenville television markets on February 8, 2018 with two more commercials scheduled to be release March 4th and March 19th.

After discussion, the Board members directed Mr. Campbell to make the video files available on the Board's website for download by pharmacies to use on their own social media platforms. The Opioid Crisis Response Committee will also discuss making the video available for other states' boards of pharmacy to use in public service announcements.

Mr. Haywood recommended incorporating the campaign into the District III agenda material.

NC CSRS Update – Implementation of Interstate Connectivity through PMP Interconnect

The Controlled Substance Reporting System is administered by the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (NC DHHS). The North Carolina CSRS is now connected to PMP Interconnect, which is a program developed by the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy that allows data sharing among states' prescription monitoring programs. Mr. Campbell stated that this enhancement provides a significant new resource for pharmacists exercising their professional judgment when dispensing controlled substances.

Financial Report

Krystal Smith, Account Manager, presented the January 2018 financial report to the Board.

Investigations and Inspections Report

Krystal Stefanyk, Director of Inspections, presented the 2017 investigative report.

NABP District III Meeting, August 12-14, 2018, Asheville, NC

Mr. Campbell reminded members that the 2018 District III meeting will be hosted by the Board and Campbell University College of Pharmacy & Health Sciences August 12 – 14, 2018 at the Renaissance Hotel in Asheville, NC. Mr. Campbell, Dr. Bowman, and Dr. Michael Adams (Dean of Campbell University, College of Pharmacy & Health Sciences) have begun planning the agenda. He admitted to self-medicate with Schedule IV drugs. On April 26, 2017 he agreed not to practice pharmacy and entered into a 5 year recovery monitoring agreement with PHP. Recommendation: License suspended, deemed served from April 26, 2017 to date of order, with conditions including not serving as PM for 6 months, then may serve if deemed appropriate by PHP and ED. Accepted by Nguyen 2/19/2018.
