# Consideration of Minutes of the May 2019 Meeting

The members received the May 15, 2018 meeting minutes prior to this meeting for review. It was moved by Mr. Minton, seconded by Mr. Graves, to approve the minutes as submitted. The motion passed with no dissenting votes.

## Recognition of Board Member Stan Haywood

"Some men are born for the public. Nature by fitting them for the service of the human race on a broad scale, has stamped them with the evidences of her destination and their duty." Thomas Jefferson

No one exemplified Thomas Jefferson's observation better than Stay Haywood. We lost Stan on May 22. Stan was serving his third term as a Board member, the first Board member to have ever served his statutorily allowed two consecutive terms, sit out a term, and then be chosen again by the state's pharmacists to resume a post as guardian of the public health.

The trust and confidence that the pharmacists of this state placed in Stan demonstrated that Stan was, above all things, a servant leader throughout his life. Stan's commitments to his family, his church, scouting, Randolph County (through long service as a member of the School Board and as a County Commissioner), and the state were deep and abiding. Those commitments were matched by a sense of humility and self-deprecation that proved Stan's focus ever remained on service to others, not service to self.

Stan also possessed the rare gifts of having a mind open to positions utterly different than his own and an ability to disagree on policy matters in a respectful way.

The Board proudly established the L. Stanley Haywood Recovery Fund in April and endowed it with \$1.1 million to provide financial support to qualifying pharmacists and pharmacy personnel in need of substance abuse assessment, treatment, and monitoring services. Stan championed

proactive measures to stem the opioid public health crisis, and we are grateful that Stan was able to see this transformative program through to completion.

Even as Stan fought serious illness over the past year, he demonstrated daily the ability to draw sustenance from faith and family. We loved Stan. We mourn his loss. And we are thankful beyond measure for his service, his inspiration, and his example. Our love extends to his wife, Hope, and his sons, Drew, Jon, and Mark.

The adjourned for a Break at 10:15am and resumed open session at 10:23am.

## <u>Consideration of Reinstatement Application – RPh. Jennifer Christian</u>

RPh. Jennifer Christian, license #15579, appeared before the Board to petition for action on her reinstatement application. Dr. Christian's pharmacist license lapsed in December 2015 for non-renewal. She requested a waiver from the Board's reinstatement policy that requires licensees who have been not practiced pharmacy for more than two (2) years but less than five (5) years to obtain 500 hours of internship. Dr. Christian stated that she has worked continuously in the pharmaceutical research industry. Dr. Christian provided the members with a CV showing her extensive work experience. She would like the opportunity to serve as a preceptor for pharmacy students interested in pursuing careers within industry as she had previously done for pharmacy students from the University of Iowa- School of Pharmacy.

After discussion, on a motion from Mr. Mixon, seconded by Dr. Bowman with no dissenting votes, the Board granted the requested waiver of internship hours.

### Financials

Accounting Manager Krystal Smith resigned her position at the Board in June 2018. Mr. Campbell introduced and welcomed JP Brown as the Board's new Accounting Manager.

Mr. Brown presented the May 2018 financial report to the Board.

### **Investigative Statistics**

Joshua Kohler, Director of Investigations, presented the June 2018 investigative report.

### Legislative Update

Mr. Campbell updated the Board on three bills are presently active in the short-session.

S.616 – Heron and Opioid Prevention and Enforcement Act (HOPE Act) – is a proposed Senate bill which amends laws pertaining to the North Carolina Controlled Substance Act and the North Carolina Substances Reporting System Act. The bill, among other provisions, gives local law enforcement the authority to have direct, open access to prescription records in a pharmacy and to the Controlled Substance Reporting System. To date, the current version of this bill cleared the House Health Committee and House Judiciary I, and is scheduled for a House floor vote on June 13.

H.974/S735 – Reform Financial Reporting of Occupational Licensing Board is a bill that purports to standardize certain required financial reporting of Occupational Licensing Boards. One requirement of the bill is that all Occupational Licensing Boards operate on a July 1 through June 30 fiscal year by July 1, 2019. The Board's financial department is preparing for these possible changes. The bill has cleared the Senate and been transmitted to the House.

H701 – OLB Uniform Discipline and Increase Oversight. This bill seeks to clarify certain procedural and substantive authorities in light of the FTC v. Dental Board decision. It passed the House on April 25, 2017. It remains in Senate Rule Committee.

## Procedure for Filling Board Member Vacancies

With the passing of Mr. Haywood, Mr. Campbell updated the Board on the law and procedures for filling a vacancy on the Board. Per N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-85.7(a), the remaining pharmacist members of the Board are required to elect a replacement pharmacist member to fill the unexpired term. Because the voting is limited to "pharmacist members," the public member is statutorily prohibited from voting on the replacement.

After discussion and recommendations from Board staff and counsel, the Board members will elect a new representative from the central district in which Mr. Haywood served. Board staff was directed to communicate through the website and e-mail that staff will take nominations through close of business Friday, July 6, 2018. Candidates must submit signatures of ten (10) pharmacists from the central district for consideration as candidate.

Board staff will provide materials submitted by all eligible candidates to the current Board members on Monday, July 9, 2018. All candidates will be invited to appear at the Board's July 17, 2018 meeting. Each candidate may make a five (5) minute presentation to the Board members. The members will then consider and vote on filling the vacancy.

## 2018 Board Retreat and Location

Mr. Campbell reminded Board members that the 2018 Board Retreat will be held at the Proximity Hotel in Greensboro on October 4 & 5, 2018.
